The 2020-21 RBBC Year of *Receiving One Another* is underway! This will be an intentional focus for the next 12 months. This command is found in Romans 15:7. I brought an expositional study on this verse/subject on Sunday evening, November 29. Cathie raved about the message (a somewhat common practice for her!), so be sure to listen online if you missed it.

God designed His people to be interrelational. We need each other. There are a number of metaphors used in Scripture to represent the church. One such concept is that the church is the body of Christ (1 Cor.12:27). Body parts are interrelated. The heart must have oxygen, so the respiratory system is fundamentally important. The respiratory system must interrelate with the circulatory system to transport the oxygen around the body. A myriad of examples could be offered with how the body parts are interrelational.

So too is the body of Christ. Yes, we're individual members, but we don't all do that same thing. Each member of the body of Christ has been designed to function in unique ways. I can't be who you're supposed to be in the body of Christ, and vice-versa.

Clearly, 2020 has been the most difficult year in the overall functional life of the body of Christ in our culture, and likely throughout the world. However, it's not been without fruit. We've learned to function in new ways, which arguably, would not have happened if Covid-19 had not visited us. The bottom-line is that we'll only give ourselves to *Receiving One Another* to the degree that we're intentional. This is a command from God to His people. We're commanded to be intentionally involved with one another so that we're built up (strengthened) for the glory of God.

One way the command to give ourselves to *Receiving* One Another can be realized is a new emphasis on home fellowship meetings. Those who desire can host or attend home fellowships around the city. This can take place about anywhere and about anytime, even on Sunday evenings! Yes, there will still be worship services on Sunday evenings at 6 PM. But, so many have expressed a desire to have reqular home fellowships that the Deacons and I have recently agreed to carve out a spot in church life for this to take place. So, come to the church campus on Sunday evenings for music and preaching, or attend a home fellowship. Some home fellowship groups might opt for a different time to meet. Please steer clear of Wednesday evenings because of our corporate prayer meeting and Awana. Of course, everyone will want to be in attendance together at the church building when we observe the Lord's Suppertypically once-a-month.

So, Red Bridger: are you characterized by **Receiving One Another**? Are you involved in the lives of your brothers &

sisters in Christ. If not, then please commit this very moment to give yourself to interrelational life in the body of Christ. You'll be blessed by others; others will be blessed by you; and, God will be glorified in our midst.
